The establishment of Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya Govt. Model College, Katlicherra, Hailakandi by the RUSA and the Government of Assam in 2020 is a matter of pride for the people of Katlicherra in particular, and the Hailakandi District in general. It is a dream project of the Assam government, funded by the Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA). The college came into being as a result of the continuous efforts of the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Assam and the RUSA, Assam, and the college has finally been able to open its doors to the first batch of students for the academic year 2020-2021. We successfully completed our first academic session with the help of all college stakeholders. Initially, the college's goals were limited to providing education in the Arts stream only.

Model College, Katlicherra will admit its second batch of students for the academic session 2021-2022 for Higher Secondary 1st Year Arts and B.A. 1st Semester classes. The permanent campus of the College, is likely to be established at Sultanicherra, the southern part of Hailakandi District. The college's temporary campus is conveniently located at Unused building (Girls' Hostel and MSDP Building) of Jamira High School, Jamira Bazar, near national highway 154. Which is at a short distance of about 3.5 kms from the original venue Sultanicherra and about 47 km away from district headquarter, Hailakandi.

Despite the fact that the college's infrastructure has not yet been constructed, we do not want to keep the students of this region waiting any longer. We expect to complete all of the construction work within a year or two. Meanwhile, I'd like to invite all deserving students from the region to enroll in this college and become a part of this historic initiative, as well as participate in our progress toward excellence.

The College offers Higher Secondary courses (10+2) in Arts Stream under Assam Higher Secondary Education Council, Guwahati, as well as Bachelor of Arts course under Assam University, Silchar. The College is affiliated to Assam University, Silchar from the academic session 2020-2021. Very soon, the College will get permission from Assam Higher Secondary Education Council, Guwahati.

A slew of highly qualified and dedicated faculty members will make every effort to impart education while also monitoring students on a regular basis for overall improvement. I consider myself very fortunate to be able to inform you that we have well-qualified and energetic teachers who are enthusiastic about their profession. I hope that our students will be able to excel in their academic and intellectual pursuits as a result of their participation in this institution.

COLLEGE PROFILE

1. About the College

The establishment of the Model Degree College is a part of the proactive measures undertaken by the Government of India to expand higher educational facilities and ensure that all states in the country meet the national average of Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) in higher education. To fulfill this, the Central Government has launched an important scheme- “Scheme for Financing New Model Colleges in Educationally Backward Districts (EBDs)”, which is essentially a motivational mechanism for state governments to improve educational outcomes in underserved districts by providing appropriate financial assistance. Under this scheme Government of Assam established five Model Degree Colleges in the year 2017, and all these Model Degree Colleges were named after Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya, a great thinker, philosopher, sociologist and politician of the country. The Government of Assam, in its second phase, established six new Govt. Model Degree Colleges in the year 2020, which were later renamed as Govt. Model College. Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya, Govt. Model College, Katlicherra is one of these six newly established Government Model Colleges.

Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya Government Model College, Katlicherra, Hailakandi was proposed to be built at Sultanicherra Garden under South Hailakandi Constituency, which is about 48 km far from Hailakandi, the district headquarter and 33 km from Lala town. The transport and communication facilities of the area are adequately developed, and the college is well connected to district headquarter and other parts of the Hailakandi district. Although the permanent building of the college is yet to be constructed, it starts functioning profusely at a temporary venue located in Jamira High School Campus. The majority of the villagers residing around the college are educationally and finically backward. The college is a blazing light in this educationally backward and interior region which will empower and enlighten the learners. It being the only college, the ambitious students can see a ray of hope to pursue higher studies which was earlier a dream they cherished. Now they can mould their future in this holy shrine of learning. The College has started its journey only with faculty of Arts comprising of eight departments viz, English, Bengali, Economics, Political Science, History, Geography, Education and Mathematics. The college has opened its doors for the first batch of students from the academic session 2020-21. After successfully completing the third academic session, the college has started its admission process for Higher Secondary 1st Year (Arts) and B.A. 1st Semester for the academic session 2024-25.

At present, the college is offering Higher Secondary Course in arts stream under Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC) and four year under-graduate programme in accordance with NEP 2020 under Assam University, Silchar. The aim of the college is to impart quality higher education and prepare the students for their secure future and noble humanitarian cause, thereby contributing much to society. As it is a Government Model College, each and every classroom and department is well-equipped with modern advanced technologies, and students are being taught by a galaxy of highly qualified and dedicated faculty members who are putting their best efforts to impart quality education along with continuous monitoring of students for their overall improvement.

TWO YEARS HIGHER SECONDARY COURSE

The Two-Year Higher Secondary Course is administered according to the regulations set forth by the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC). This course spans two academic years: the First Year and the Second Year, also known as the Final Year. Admission to the HS course commences promptly following the announcement of the HSLC Examination results by the Board of Secondary Education, Assam (SEBA). The admission schedule is publicized in alignment with the notifications issued by the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council. It is noteworthy that the admission process is facilitated through the Darpan portal.

2. ELIGIBILITY

For seeking admission to the First Year of Higher Secondary Course, a candidate must have passed H.S.L.C. Examination of Board of Secondary Education (SEBA) or Secondary Examination of CBSE or other Boards examination recognised by Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC). Candidates other than SEBA will have to produce Migration Certificate in due time, else their candidature will be cancelled. Admission in H.S. Course will be given strictly on the basis of merit, and Admission Committee will finalise the list of candidates for admission. There is a provision for reservation of seats for students belonging to SC, ST, OBC, MOBC, PWD, etc. Any break in studies after passing HSLC or equivalent examination must be supported by a GAP Certificate issued as per specified proforma by an appropriate authority.

3. COURSE-CURRICULA

The course and curricula of H.S. are conducted as per the rules and regulations of the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC). Students seeking admission in HS First Year will have three core subjects and can choose four elective subjects from the list given below, of which

three elective subjects are mandatory, and the fourth elective is optional and will not carry any extra marks. As per council's guidelines, marks of the best three elective subjects will be considered.

** A student who opted for the M.I.L. subject other than Bengali will have to take permission from the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC), Guwahati.*

N.B.: – Change of subject(s) after admission is not encouraged. However, in special circumstances, application for change of subject(s) is required to be made to the principal through the respective HoDs within one month from the date of admission. Application received thereafter will not be accepted.

5. EXAMINATIONS

The Course comprises two examinations viz. i) First Year and ii) Second Year or Final Year. Promotion to Second Year or Final Year depends on the successful completion of the first-year examination conducted under the guidelines of Assam Higher Secondary Education Council, Guwahati. The unsuccessful candidates in H.S. first year and H.S. second year may re-appear as per rules of AHSEC at the next final examination as non-collegiate candidate.

In addition to the examinations conducted by Council, for comprehensive study and to keep students involved with studies after completion of each unit/chapter respective subject teacher will assess the achievement of each student. Besides, there will be two Unit Tests, and the schedule for the same will be notified to the Notice Board by the Examination Cell.

Four Year Undergraduate Programme Under New Education Policy-2020

A. FYUG

❖ DEGREE PROGRAMME OFFERED

The Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUG) at Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya Govt. Model College, Katlicherra, is affiliated with Assam University, Silchar, and as such, is governed by the rules and regulations of the University. The FYUG course is divided into eight semesters with internal examinations/assignments/seminars and an end- semester examination in each semester. The University conducts all the semester examinations, and after satisfactory performances in all the semesters, a candidate will be awarded the final degree on the basis of a composite score in all the semesters.

❖ PROGRAMME OF STUDY UNDER FYUG

The institution provides a Four-Year Undergraduate (FYUG) Course under the National Education Policy 2020. The duration of FYUG is four years, and each year consists of two semesters each of six months' duration. However, the course is divided into four parts:

- i. Certificate** is awarded for successfully completing on one year course.
- ii. Diploma** is awarded for successfully completing two years course.
- iii. Bachelor's Degree** is awarded for successfully completing a three-year course.
- iv. Bachelor's Degree with Honours** is awarded for successfully completing four years

Note: *Entry and exit in the course is open so a student can leave the institution after completing one, two, or three years and rejoin to complete the remaining course with in the student's life cycle of 7 years.*

Note: *Maximum duration for the completion of a FYUG program of study is 7 (seven) years at a stretch from the date of admission (i.e, 10 (ten) consecutive End Semester Examinations) as per the "Guidelines on Determination of a Uniform Span Period within which a student may be allowed to Qualify for a Degree" published by UGC dated October 15, 2015. This criterion shall be strictly adhered to while determining the eligibility to appear in any ESE for Arrear Paper/s, and Betterment Examination.*

❖ ELIGIBILITY FOR THE AWARD OF DEGREE IN FYUG

A registered student shall be eligible for the award of a Bachelor's Degree only if he/she has undergone the FYUG programme of study in a college affiliated with the University for a period of not less than three academic years and successfully completes all the examinations of all six semesters prescribed for the program. A candidate is eligible for the award of degree in FYUG, on successful completion of the FYUG Honours program by passing all the papers of the prescribed courses as per the Course Structure with a minimum of 160 credits

❖ CLASS ATTENDANCE

Class attendance percentage of each subject in each semester shall be calculated on the basis of total class attended percent number of classes held in the semester. A student with less than 75 per cent of attendance on a paper shall not be allowed to appear in the end semester examination in the particular subject. However, the student can take admission in the next semester and appear in the similar examinations if he/she has secured the passing marks in the previous semesters; otherwise, they have to reappear in the sessional test in the concern paper. If the student secured passing marks in all the sessional test in the previous semesters, then the internal marks would be carried on to the next semesters.

❖ ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION IN FYUG

Candidates for admission to the FIRST SEMESTER of FYUG shall be required to have passed the Higher Secondary (+2) or its equivalent Examinations conducted by any recognized University/ Board/Council, which shall be treated as qualifying examination. Provided that candidate for admission into the specific programme of study shall also possess such other qualifying conditions as may be prescribed by the University or concerned college.

B. ADMISSION PROCESS IN FYUG

❖ Guidelines Under CUET/NON-CUET

In PDU Govt. Model College, Katlicherra, a student can take admission both through CUET and Non-CUET mode. A student must mention whether he/she has applied for CUET during the registration process along with other details.

❖ Academic Bank of Credits

Academic Bank of Credits has been established on the lines of the National Academic Depository (NAD), in the sense, NAD is the backbone of ABC, where the students' academic data are held and academic awards are stored (i.e. storehouse of academic awards). Despite the fact that ABC enables students to register or commence credit transfer, the final outcomes of credit redemption and issuance of certificates, as well as the compilation of award records, are administered by academic institutions via the NAD Platform. Hence being the owner of academic awards, Academic Institutions must mandatorily register themselves under ABC via NAD. Before enrolling in FYUG courses, students have to register their name in the Academic Bank of Credit (<https://www.abc.gov.in>) using their Aadhaar number and registered mobile number.

❖ Samarth Admission Portal

In the session 2024-25, the Department of Higher Education Assam facilitates the students for early registration in the admission portal. Later the students can choose the colleges and universities they deem to join.

C. GUIDELINES FOR FYUG EXAMINATION

The examination under FYUG is parted into two categories. First is internal assessment through Internal Examination/Assignment/Seminar/Project report along with the marks obtained in attendance. Second is session examination in the end of each semester. The following points are enumerated in respect of FYUG examinations.

- Marking system on percentage of attendance is same as CBCS. 10 marks for paper without practical and 6 marks for paper with practical
- Total marks allotted for internal examination/ assignment/ seminar/ project report is 20 marks for papers without practical and 14 marks for papers with practical.
- Total marks allotted for practical examination is 30 marks
- For sessional examination, total marks allotted for paper without practical is 70 marks and with practical is 50 marks.
- A student must attain the minimum marks in internal assessment in order to sit in the final examination. Out of 20 marks he/she has to attain 8 marks and out of 14 marks he/she has to attain 6 marks in internal examination/ assignment/ seminar/ project report and a minimum of 75% in class attendance. Further, a student must attain a minimum of 12 marks out of 30 marks in total internal assessment.
- A student fails to attain the minimum marks in the internal assessment will not be allowed to sit in the final examination
